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**On October 24 The United Nations Association of Georgia, in cooperation with the United Nations Development Programme in Georgia launches the series of Model UN Sessions in Tbilisi, Gori, Batumi and Kutaisi. The MUN cycle will be dedicated to celebrating the UN 61<sup>st</sup> Anniversary and will address the issues of Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).**

Totally 129 students from different educational institutions of different regions of Georgia, are gathered for simulating the UN General Assembly and debating the United Nations Millennium Development Goals signed by the member states within the frames of the Millennium Declaration 2000.

The Delegates to the General Assembly Session were tasked to discuss and estimate the progresses reached by the member states in regard of achieving the MDGs in their countries. Delegates were also tasked to elaborate the supplementary mechanisms for improving the governments' performance in MDG implementation. Respectively, participants had to research the whole socio-political life of their countries, the UN system and the MDGs to be successful, thus guaranteeing the better promotion of Millennium Development Goals and UN Values within the Georgian youth. After 2 weeks of researches and orientation meetings with UNAG MUN trainers, delegates of the different key actor countries of the international politics had to provide the simulated General Assembly with the presentations on their achievements with MDGs, and further debate the progresses and fails of their partner countries, thus leading to elaboration of the new resolution, promoting and leading the member states to the better world.

Model UN is worldwide known diplomatic game, presenting the huge opportunity to the participants to obtain various skills of researching, formal and informal negotiations, speechmaking, debating, writing skills and etc. Model UN is also especially popular and highly appreciated by youth in Georgia, as it gives the real opportunity to the participants to feel themselves as the real decision-makers, and to see how the world is really run.

Participants will be presented the certificates of appreciation signed by the Executive Director of UNAG and the UN Resident Coordinator in Georgia.

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
